Ep.1 Whose Job Is It to Rehabilitate These Mines?

1 – What are the names of the three open cut coal mines in the Latrobe Valley?

2 – What is/are the major difference(s) between an 'open cut' mine and an underground 'tunnel' mine?

3 – What is the land area covered by the three Latrobe Valley open cut mines in total.

4 Can you provide a size comparison for this area? For example, how many Melbourne Cricket Grounds would fit within it? Alternatively, could you estimate what portion of the Mornington Peninsula these mines might cover?

5 – What 'transition' is taking place regarding the open cut coal mines in the Latrobe Valley?
6 – Where is the Latrobe Valley? Relative (in relation to somewhere) and Exact (latitude and longitude)? Calculate how far one of the mines is from where you live.
7 – Who/what was formed in 2020 to help facilitate the rehabilitation of declared mine sites towards safe, stable and sustainable landforms?
8 – Which Victorian Government organisation was originally the owner/operator of the three Latrobe Valley open cut coal mines?
9 – Who was originally in charge of this organisation; what else is this person famous for? What 'things' has he lent his name to in Victoria?
10 – Who is responsible for the clean-up and rehabilitation of the mines and the surrounding mine land now?
11 – Can you identify who are some of the Government <i>regulators</i> that oversee that the mine owners are following the laws?

12 - Research ONE of these regulators; what is it that they do and how?

13 – Mining licences stipulate that there are THREE major factors to be considered in mine rehabilitation. What are they?

14 – What do you think each of those terms means? Tip: Perhaps use the vocabulary located <u>here</u>.

15 – What might be some of the limiting factors for rehabilitation of the three open cut coal mines in the Latrobe Valley?

16 - Use Google Maps, Google Earth, the State Library of Victoria (Image search) and/or other image sources to support your reasons for listing your "Limiting Factors to Rehabilitation".
